



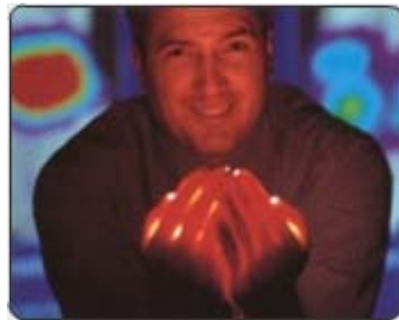

Defense basic research, also known as 6.1 research, is part of the U.S. Department of Defense's Research, Development, Test and Evaluation's Science and Technology Program. Basic research produces new knowledge in a scientific or technology area of importance to the military. About 60% of basic research awards go to universities through grants or contracts, with California's research universities leading the way.
