As the worldwide leader in biomedical research and innovation, California's more than 2,700 biotechnology, medical device and diagnostics companies invest \$26 billion a year toward the development of new tests, technologies and therapies for ailments such as cancer, diabetes, Alzheimer's and HIV/AIDS as well as cardiovascular, respiratory and infectious diseases. The life sciences industry is also an important engine of economic growth for the state, providing more than \$18 billion in wages and salaries to 258,000 workers.

The industry's continued growth and vitality depends largely on the well-educated, talented scientists and engineers. To meet these workforce demands, an increasing number of colleges and universities are adopting Professional Science Master's (PSM) programs. The PSM is an innovative graduate degree designed to allow students to pursue advanced training in science, while simultaneously developing workplace skills highly valued by employers. PSM programs prepare graduates for careers in business, government, or nonprofit organizations, combining rigorous study in science or mathematics with coursework in management, policy, law or related fields.
