On Friday, June 27, 2008, the California Institute will convene a luncheon briefing featuring remarks by Megan Schwarzman, MD, MPH, and Michael Wilson, PhD, MPH, who lead the Program in Green Chemistry and Chemicals Policy at the School of Public Health of the University of California, Berkeley

Drs. Schwarzman and Wilson are research scientists working with policy makers on the linkages between chemicals policy, green chemistry, sustainable economic growth and public and environmental health. They will present findings of their 2006 green chemistry report to the California Legislature and their 2008 briefing document, Green Chemistry: Cornerstone to a Sustainable California, commissioned by California EPA and signed by over 120 UC faculty members.
