



SPECIAL REPORT: California Results from General Election held on November 2, 2004

The following table shows final vote totals for California from yesterday's general election for President, U.S. Senate, House of Representatives, and the 16 statewide ballot propositions. Challenger John Kerry outpolled President George Bush by approximately 10 percentage points in California, Senator Barbara Boxer was reelected by approximately a 20-point margin, and all 51 serving Members of Congress that sought reelection won their races.

The state's House delegation will continue to include 33 Democrats and 20 Republicans, with party membership unchanged in California's two open House seats -- Dan Lungren won the race to succeed retiring Rep. Doug Ose by a 27-point margin, and Jim Costa won the race to succeed Rep. Cal Dooley by 7.4 percentage points.

All results are as of Wednesday morning, November 3, 2004 at 6:41 am PST, and are courtesy of the California Secretary of State's office.
